

 - 1) Most Polluted City.



Mexico City, Mexico, has levels of sulfur dioxide, carbon monoxide and other poisonous gases more than double those deemed acceptable by the World Health Organization.

2) Most Chemically Polluted Town.

The Russian town of Dzerzhinsk is home to dozens of factories that produce chlorine, pesti- cides and chemical weapons. Greenpeace has declared Dzerzhinsk the site of the worst chemical pollution in Russia and its lake the most poisonous in the world. Average life expectancy in the town is just 42 for men and 47 for women.

3) Lowest Ozone Levels.

The world's lowest ozone levels within the ozone layer were recorded in October 1993 over the South Pole, Antarctica, which



influenced badly on shielding the Earth from solar ultraviolet radiation.

4) Worst Land Pollution.

From February to October 1994, thousands of tons of crude oil flowed across the Arctic tundra of the Komi Republic, Russia. An estimated 98,400 tons of oil leaked in a spillage that was 11,2 miles long.

5) Worst Marine Pollution.

Between 1953 and 1967, a fertilizer factory in Minamata Bay, Kyushu, Japan, deposited methyl mercury compound into the sea. Up to 4,500 people were seriously harmed and 800 died as a result of the factory's actions.

6) Worst River Pollution.

In November, 1986, firefighters fighting a blane at the Sandon chemical works in Basel, Switzerland, flushed 29,5 tons of agricultural chemicals into the river Rhine, killing 500,000 fish.



7) Most Devastating Air Pollution.

More than 6,300 people have died from the effects of a poisonous cloud of methyl isocyanate that escaped from the pesticide plant near Bhopal, India, in December 1984. The company made a settlement of \$391 million to compensate victims and their relatives.

8) Worst Nuclear Reactor Disaster.

The world's worst ever-nuclear reactor disaster took place at Chernobyl No. 4 in the USSR (now Ukraine) in April 1986. Contamination was experienced over an area of 10,900 sq miles and about 1,7 million people were exposed to varying amounts of radiation.

9) Most Acidic Rain was recorded over the Great Lakes in the USA and Canada in 1982.

10) Biggest Consumer of Energy.

The USA is the world's largest consumer of both fossil fuels (coal, oil, natural gas) and of commercial energy (these plus nuclear and hydro power).

11) Most Paper Recycled.

In Germany, between 70 and 80 % of paper and cardboard is recycled after use.



- 12) Most Organically Farmed Land.
- 10 % of the land in Austria is farmed organically.
- 13) Highest Solar Energy Use per Capita.In relation to its population, Switzerland uses

more solar energy than any other country in the world. It is followed by Germany and Japan.

14) Highest Glass Recycling Rate.

Switzerland leads the world in recycling glass, with an estimated 91 % of all glass products sold in the country being recycled after use. It is closely followed by Austria and Netherlands, which recycle over 80 % of all disposable glass.


15) Biggest Landscape Restoration Project.

The current \$8 billion project to restore as much as possible of the Everglades wetlands, Florida, USA, is the biggest ecological restoration

project in history. The Everglades are the largest remaining subtropical wilderness in the USA.

16) The World Wide Fund For Nature (WWF) is the world's largest independent conservation organization.

Registered as a charity on September 11, 1961, it has around 5 million supporters in some 100 countries. The aim of the WWF is to protect nature and conserve biological diversity.



17) Longest-Running Environmental Campaign.

The environmental pressure group Greenpeace was founded in 1971 and has been campaigning against nuclear testing ever since. Its first protest was against testing off the coast of Alaska, USA.

Each positive answer gives you one point, each negative answer gives you a zero. You:


- 1. Would rather walk or ride a bike than use means of transportation.

Count your score and analyse the results.


- 16—19: You definitely think globally and act locally. Good for you.
